

Incorporated: 1931 First Settled: 1665

Origin: There were groups of Indians living sporadically along Hog Neck's coastal regions in very early times. They found the place rich in shellfish and wild game, providing everything they needed for their daily existence.

In October 1665 the Freeholders of Southampton Town purchased Hog Neck (as North Haven was called prior to 1842) from the Manhanset Indians of Shelter Island for "six Indian Coates and the right to continue to hunt and fish on the land". This is the earliest documented evidence of Indian habitation on Hog Neck. This 1665 deed is still intact.

In June 1680 forty-seven lots were laid out by the officials of Southampton Town. Forty-seven individuals' names were drawn and they became the first property owners at Hog Neck. Within a year these Southampton men began to sell and trade the lots hoping to capitalize on their investments, and thus began the earliest transfer of property on Hog Neck.


