10	Eileen and discussing some other things
11	with the State, we had the dock revised to
12	something shorter and more consistent with
13	the area. It has all the local and State
14	and federal environmental approvals, as it
15	should. It was designed based on the
16	specifications in Village Code, and then
17	it was revised further again based on the
18	recommendations from Mr. Hajek and his

10	floating dock, for example?
11	MS. RIGDON: I think you would use
12	a longer one for a floating dock. This
13	one specifically just to access the top
14	deck of the boat.

16	they would be where on the dock?
17	MS. RIGDON: About partway down.
18	Now, the engineer, when he designed this,
19	kind of said "to be determined," but
20	basically, let's just say, for instance,
21	the craft is here, it's about 30 feet
22	long, it would be halfway.
23	MS. DIAT: Okay.
24	MS. RIGDON: So about ten feet

5	because when you're docking a boat,
6	depending on the weather, the tide, the
7	fetch, he doesn't know which side of the
8	dock he would be able to dock on. If the
9	wind is coming from the north, he would
10	have to dock on the south side of the
11	dock. So, hence the two flip upstairs, so
12	he could get off and on the boat no matter
13	what the condition or tide.
14	MS. DIAT: Okay. I have to say,
15	I've seen many, many, many, many, many
16	docks in my time and I've never seen
17	retractable stairs to access a boat from a
18	dock, but okay.
19	And so those are different than
20	the alluminum retractable flip-up dock
21	MS. RIGDON: No, that is. That's
22	the stairs.
23	MS. DIAT: to watercraft steps?
24	Oh, it's the same.
25	MS. RIGDON: That's the same

- 4 MS. RIGDON: The retractable.

6	alluminum. They're lightweight.

8	they electric?
9	MS. SKILBRED: The retractable?
10	MS. RIGDON: They're manual,
11	actually.
12	MR. SIMPSON: That's kind of like
13	the picture right there.
14	MS. DIAT: Right. We saw the
15	picture.
16	MAYOR SANDER: Yeah, that's the
17	one you have in the package, right.
18	MS. RIGDON: Yeah, there was a
19	picture.
20	MR. SIMPSON: And it's New Wave
21	MS. DIAT: Okay.
22	MR. SIMPSON: New Wave
23	Fabrication.
24	MS. RIGDON: Because there's no
25	ramp and no traditional float assembly,

10	ladder
11	MS. RIGDON: A ladder, they get
12	MS. DIAT: most docks have
13	ladders on have.
14	MS. RIGDON: True. They get
15	slippery.
16	MS. DIAT: Right.
17	MS. RIGDON: And it's really hard
18	to get on and off a boat when you have a
19	cooler and you're carrying things and
20	fishing equipment, to climb up and down
21	the ladder. You wouldn't be able to boat
22	alone to be able to do that. So it's a
23	safety issue, really, to safely access the
24	craft.

2	MR. FIORE: How big a boat do you
3	plan to put here?
4	MS. RIGDON: It's designed for a
5	30- to 35-foot craft. So it has enough
6	water. It's about three-and-a-half feet.
7	(Inaudible) were done by Bob Fox,
8	confirmed by David Saskas, and then placed
9	on a survey.
10	MR. FIORE: And you know how rough
11	these winds are?
12	MS. RIGDON: How what? I'm sorry?
13	MR. SIMPSON: Yes. They
14	MR. FIORE: Especially here.
15	MR. SIMPSON: At certain times,
16	so.
17	MS. RIGDON: Yes.
18	MR. SIMPSON: Today, today they're
19	very calm.
20	MR. FIORE: Right.
21	MR. SIMPSON: But, right, so
22	there's only certain times you can, you
23	know, certain conditions
24	MR. FIORE: Right.
25	MR. SIMPSON: obviously you

- 2 gotta be careful.
- 3 MR. FIORE: Right. There's no
- 4 lift, so those are out.
- 5 MR. SIMPSON: Right.
- MS. RIGDON: No, no lift.
- 7 So we did design it to have some
- bumper piles. So, you know, when it gets
- 9 rocking and rolling, the boat does not hit
- 10 the dock, and it's basically contained so
- 11 you can tie it to these four bumper piles.
- 12 There's also two bumper piles in the front
- 13 because there's two boulders there.
- MS. DIAT: And the bumper piles, I
- think, the question on those is, are those
- 16 15 feet? I think Billy had the question
- 17 that those appear --
- MS. RIGDON: Oh, like, on center?
- MS. DIAT: -- to be from 15 feet.
- 20 MS. RIGDON: 15 feet on center --
- MS. DIAT: Okay.
- 22 MS. RIGDON: -- is
- 23 traditionally --
- MS. DIAT: I think that's higher,
- 25 though, than the Code allows, though,

- 3 MS. RIGDON: Oh, do you mean the

- 9 safety and navigation purposes, is six
- 10 point -- keep in mind, the dock is two
- 11 different levels. One's 12 inches, the
- 12 higher, the seaward-most section. So it
- would -- the top of it would be 7.8 feet
- 14 from the lower section and 6.8 feet from
- the longer section, the 69-foot section.
- 16 MS. SKILBRED: Above the dock?
- MS. RIGDON: Above the dock.
- These poles are, like, 40 feet long and
- they need to be driven 25 feet. So in
- order to tie a boat up, they need to
- 21 extend higher because you tie diagonally,
- and they kind of have to be higher in
- order to keep the boat in place.
- Otherwise, you know, we don't have a lift.
- We don't have whips, et cetera.

2 MS. SKILBRED: We don't allow

3 lifts.

4 MS. RIGDON: We don't allow that.

5 MR. FIORE: You can't have those

on Long Island.

MS. RIGDON: Exactly. So this is
the only other way, you know, to keep the
boat safe when he's not there using it.

MS. SKILBRED: Billy also talked
about is the public access. Is that
impeded by these?

MS. RIGDON: We double, triple

checked that. I had the engineer actually

go back out to the property and he

measured the beach grade, which, of

course, varies slightly depending on

accretion of the beach or not. And at

this point, it's worst case scenario right now, and with sea level rise, et cetera,

it's just gonna get higher. But we have

22 6.10 feet between the bottom of the joists

and headers to the beach grade. So a

normal person's, you know, at best, 6.4,

six-and-a-half feet, roughly, you know,

2	6'5", generally. We don't get many people
3	above six-and-a-half feet. So, but we do
4	have a clearance that's required. The
5	Code doesn't specify, per say, but we have
6	6'10" clear to be able to walk under the
7	dock.
8	MS. SKILBRED: Along the whole
9	just under one spot?
10	MS. RIGDON: No. Along the entire
11	section up to low water. Cross bracing
12	for the dock doesn't actually start until
13	after the water seaward. And when the
14	dock is out to that particular, you know,
15	point, you have, like, 14 feet clearance,
16	roughly.
17	MR. SIMPSON: The underpass was
18	what was the width of the underpass?
19	MS. RIGDON: The width of the
20	underpass, and the Town requires it to be,
21	I think, five feet wide, roughly. We have
22	it at nine, so it's above and beyond.
23	MS. SKILBRED: Is that at high
24	tide, low tide?
25	MS. RIGDON: That's at all tides,

2	actually. But it's at the most high tide
3	where he has the deck and the stairs, and
4	the high tide literally hits the deck and
5	the stairs. It's right there. So he has
6	about you know, we maintain the
7	five-foot. But on low tides and mid-range
8	tides, we do have a good clear nine feet
9	and more, actually, to low water. So on
10	high tide, we have we maintain the
11	five-foot, but we have nine. Depends on
12	the fetch, depends on the moon. It
13	depends on a lot of things. Sometimes
14	that beach isn't even accessible at high
15	tide or storm tide or lunar tide. So, but
16	at the regular average high tide, yes, we
17	have 6.10 feet.
18	MS. DIAT: And what will the
19	electricity be used for?
20	MS. RIGDON: I didn't specify any
21	yet in the application. Most people have
22	plumbing and electric that go to the dock,
23	and that's obviously, the hose is quite
24	far away in order to, you know, hook up
25	sprayers. A lot of people hose their boat

NORTH HAVEN BOARD OF TRUSTEES - 6/22/2022 1 2 off after they use it. You know, so they 3 have plumbing and/or electric. It's not for anything above that. So if -- it's 4 5 not, like, for a lift. It's not for 6 anything electronic. It's just for basic 7 use. 8 MS. DIAT: Okay. 9 MS. RIGDON: Radios. I mean, 10 whatever. 11 MS. DIAT: But there won't be 12 lights on the dock? 13 MS. RIGDON: The dock is not 14 designed to have lights. 15

MS. DIAT: Okay. Okay.

16 MS. RIGDON: Docks only 100 feet 17 long are required to have navigational 18 lighting, and this is well under that. It 19 actually only extends 58 feet into the 20 water from the low tide mark, which is 21 less than what's required. Your max is 22 100, so.

MR. ABRAHAM: Will it have a 23

24 safety light, or?

25 MS. RIGDON: It's not supposed to,

DIAT: Well, around the bend, 7 there are. MR. ABRAHAM: Around the bend, but 8 9 there's not much else there. MR. FIORE: No, there's nothing 10 11 there. 12 MS. DIAT: We don't allow any 13 lighting, though, on the docks.

MS. RIGDON: Yeah, you don't allow lighting.

MS. SKILBRED: And the boats all have lights on them.

MS. RIGDON: I've seen sometimes

people have the lighting actually in the

walkway. And it's very, very, you know,

low-key and it's actually placed inside

the walkway just for, you know, so you

don't fall off the dock.

MS. SKILBRED: That's what Terie called the runway look, right?

3	would be they're, like, runway lights

8	we will, but it's not allowed.
9	MS. SKILBRED: No, no, there's no
10	need.
11	MR. ABRAHAM: No, no.
12	MS. RIGDON: It's not allowed,
13	yeah.
14	MS. DIAT: Okay. So, I think one
15	of the concerns we have is, when Billy had
16	put together his report and visited the
17	site, he had observed that the property,
18	when the revetment was put in in 2017, was
19	required to have a naturalized buffer.
20	MS. RIGDON: I see that comment
21	MS. DIAT: Yes.
22	MS. RIGDON: at the last
23	paragraph, that it's being
24	MS. DIAT: And so at this point,
25	we would like to have it's not there

- just reference what was supposed to be

- said, I didn't do the originals.
- 11 MAYOR SANDER: Did it specify in
- 12 the --
- MS. RIGDON: I have to have Robert
- cull that out.
- 15 MAYOR SANDER: I don't know if
- it's specified or not.
- MR. SIMPSON: I think it's just
- 18 fescue.

- MR. SIMPSON: Fescue.
- MS. RIGDON: Just, like, it's
- just -- sometimes we do, like, it's a seed
- 23 mix from Long Island Cauliflower and it's
- a tidal fescue that basically we use.

10	it marked with stones
11	MS. DIAT: Yeah, it usually is
12	something that needs to be planted as

16	put in some bushes, blueberry bushes on
17	that.

19	about blueberry. Maybe

23	beachgrass or Rosa verginica (sic) or

9	we were having there was the
10	MS. RIGDON: Ticks.
11	MR. SIMPSON: We planted the
12	fescue and then there was some, like, wild
13	grassing. I don't know if it was some of
14	the dune grass or something was, like,
15	invading it. It was, like, a very
16	fast-growing grass, so it was, like, that
17	was growing much higher
18	MS. RIGDON: Yeah, it's probably
19	salt hay, but
20	MR. SIMPSON: Than the fescues
21	grow.
22	MS. RIGDON: I mean, regardless,
23	the area has to be marked off with stones
24	or something and then you gotta give your
25	landscapers, like, a no-mow zone.

BUTTS: I just think -- I'm 12 not quite sure what they do look like, but --13

MS. SKILBRED: Here, see the picture.

MS. RIGDON: So you can basically stand on the boat and pulley the rope, and then from the boat you can actually lower these up or down.

MR. BUTTS: Yup.

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MS. RIGDON: So they're not permanent structures, for sure.

MR. SIMPSON: Yeah, even the type of thing where if they were, like, a big storm coming and you probably, probably

17	North Haven is a designated, recognized
18	MS-4. And as far as one of the
19	requirements of our permit, is that we
20	file an annual report every year. It's
21	due on June 1st and it's for a period up
22	until March 9th of this year. So right
23	now we are in the process of recording and
24	keeping data of the questions that the New
25	York State DEC wants from us in our annual

2 report.

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It is a form report. It's

questions that are formatted by the DEC

and the Department. It asks questions

about public education. It asks questions

about what we're doing as a municipality

to address erosion, contamination of

surface waters, et cetera.

I would say, in representing the Village of North Haven, it's very easy to fill this report out because our Code and our zoning kind of is right in line with what the DEC and what this program is all about. When we talk about restricting clearing on development of lots, when we talk about managing stormwater with new development, with putting roof runoff into drywells, et cetera, you know, these are things that the DEC wants to hear about. In the report, we talk about what our practices are with respect to our facilities, roadways, cleaning, doing drainage installation, stuff along those lines. So over the course of the year,

you know, it's kind of like an accounting exercise of what we've done, and that's recorded in this report.

If the Board or should any of your Trustees have any specific comments, I'd be glad to answer them. I would say that the report, with the, you know, kind of just editing from what was submitted year past, is pretty much in line with what we've documented with the Department in previous years.

MAYOR SANDER: One question, may not be directly related to this, but we're in the process of trying to determine what kind of vegetated buffers adjacent to wetlands that we should require. And what will be helpful would be to have some science around what is the impact of runoff if you have 15 foot of buffer, 20 foot of buffer, 30 foot of buffer. I mean, how far does fertilized material make its way into the water? I guess it depends on the slope to some extent, too, and what the topography is.

MR. GAUDIELLO: Well, that's, you
know, that's -- you know, from -- my
training is engineering. I had some
biology, but, you know, I tried to stay
away from that stuff.

MAYOR SANDER: Right.

MR. GAUDIELLO: But I think you hit the nail on the head. You know, if you have a bluff or you have a slope that's 15 percent or more, the runoff coefficient that you're gonna see that gets down to the bottom of the hill is going to be much more than it would if you were looking at a percent grade of, say, one percent or two percent. So if you were dropping a foot in 100 feet, which is one percent, it'd be a lot different if you were dropping 15 feet in 100 feet, which is 15 percent.

I think, you know, that plays into it. I think the type of vegetation and the type of maintenance of that buffer also plays into it. You know, it's -- you know, the thicker the brush, the thicker

12	nitrogen and phosphorus that are in these,
13	you know, I mean, fertilizers that we kind

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our shoreline, our creeks, our bays, our tributaries, and come back to us with kind of a overall recommendation of actions to help us, you know, know what we should be doing as far as this committee goes. And so I'll talk a little bit more about that in a moment 'cause we've taken a number of steps towards that so far.

But then the other objectives we have are to then put together a plan to measure the water quality of our creeks, coves, ponds and bays, to be able to have a baseline because we don't do that now. We haven't done any testing, per say, other than finding out, quite by happenstance, that the DEC was measuring the water quality in Ganet Creek, which we didn't know about until they designated it as unsatisfactory about a month ago. And then to measure it, once we have a baseline, to measure it on an ongoing periodic basis as well, to be able to track improvements. And as well, to be able to define the types of pollutants

NORTH HAVEN BOARD OF TRUSTEES - 6/22/2022

that are prevalent and their primary

causes so that we can put the right

actions behind that. And then obviously,

have actions to address the causes of

those pollutants and be able to raise the

community awareness on the importance of

water quality initiatives.

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And so we do have a draft list of -- quite a long draft list of action plans that we think makes sense, but we really want to get kind of this overall assessment from an expert, an expert consultant in this area to make sure that we are doing the right thing. So, to that end, we have interviewed two companies so far that might do this assessment with us. We are in the process of trying to schedule with a third. We are gonna put together an RFP to send out to these companies. Two of them are ones that Chris Remkus knew of, and, in fact, we reached out to Billy and he recommended them as well, so that was good validation that we were speaking to the right people.

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2 We've also had -- we've been 3 working with Mary Ann Eddy from Sag Harbor 4 who is the chair of the Harbor Committee, and she's also been -- she's been heading 5 up the Sag Harbor water quality 6 7 initiatives. And through Mary Ann, we've had a meeting with Chris Gobler, who has 8 9 been doing the water quality testing for 10 Sag Harbor. And so we have talked to 11 Chris Gobler about potentially doing the 12 water quality testing for us here in North 13 Haven. So we have given Chris Go- -- and 14 Chris Gobler is the Ph.D. of Stony Brook 15 School of Marine and Atmospheric Sciences. And so we've given him a list of five 16 17 potential spots in North Haven that we 18 might like to do water quality testing, 19 and we're awaiting a cost for that back 20 from him, we haven't received that yet, to 21 see how much that might cost us. 22 I also had a meeting with Tommy 23 John to understand if any of this work 24 that we're talking about doing might 25 qualify for funding from CPF funds

5 MR. FIORE: Right.
